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





Figure 2: Estimated EB-5 Investment in Non-Construction-Related Sectors, in \$Million, FY2014 and 2015












Spending through the Immigration Process

- Education costs for children


Figure 3: Contributions to U.S. GDP by the EB-5 Regional Center Investor Spending, FY2014 and FY2015





EB-5 Investment Estimates by State – FY2014 & FY2015













Estimated Job Supports by EB-5 Investment by State

Key Economic Issues-Prospective EB-5 Reform



- Increase in the minimum investment amounts
 - DHS regulatory proposal: \$1.35M for TEAs and \$1.8M for all others
 - Cornyn Legislative Proposal: \$925K for TEAs and \$1.025M for all others
- Changes to Job Counting-definition of "qualifying" jobs
- Definition of Targeted Employment Area ("TEA")
 - DHS "doughnut hole" approach; Legislative proposal for 2 of 3 NMTC criteria
- New Project Categories-qualify for TEA Investment amts.
- Confusion about documenting "direct" and "indirect" jobs
